Before Donna Petrie (formerly Brown) got married, moved to BC, and started her thriving business, she grew up modestly about half a mile north of Legal. She attended high school in Westlock, where she met her husband, and later became a teller in a bank.

A hard worker, she assumed the title of loans administrator within the bank fairly quickly. Although she is a good-natured and cheerful person, she occasionally found herself feeling a little stumped by the "In" file box... it seemed that it didn't matter how hard she worked, it was never emptied. When she and her husband lived in Hinton, near Jasper, she started working in a completely different field. A husband and wife team ran a business in home redecorating and painting, and Donna found she had a knack for it. When her husband Walker also suffered a layoff, he joined forces with her, and for 22 years now the Petrie team has successfully run their business.

Four years ago, they moved back home to Legal area, and continued their business. 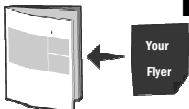

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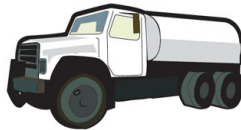

BYLAW REMINDERS - KEEP YOUR PROPERTY CLEAN

(Bylaw #06-2005 - available on the Town of Legal website)

"No owner or occupier of a property shall allow grass, grasses or weeds on the property to exceed a height of 15 cm." The area between a property owners' fence and the back alley as well as the town median is also the responsibility of the owner."

"No owner or occupier shall allow on the property an accumulation of materials as to create an unsightly condition"

"No owner or occupier of a property shall allow the external storage of more than one motor vehicle not bearing a license plate with subsisting registration."

MESSAGE FROM MORINVILLE RCMP

Thefts from vehicles remains a concern. Please help the RCMP and yourself by protecting your property. Ensure that vehicles are locked and all valuables are removed.

PERMITS—BUILDING OR RENOVATING?

Be advised that the Town of Legal has a Land Use Bylaw that may indicate a permit is needed for sheds, greenhouses, decks, garages, additions, fireplaces, hot tubs, wood burning stoves, demolitions and some renovations etc. If a development or building is constructed on any property without the proper permits, the property owner may be required to demolish, remove or replace the said development. Failure to obtain proper permits may result in fines being imposed. Swimming pools have become an increasing concern, and the Town will be enforcing the entry and site restrictions as stated in the Land Use Bylaw Section 6.21. If you require any information please contact the Town Office or you can view the Land Use Bylaw on the website.

COMPOST SITE

This is a reminder that the Town does not pick up grass clippings, leaves, branches or garden waste. There is a compost site located at the Town Shop at 5310-48 Ave where these items may be dropped off. Bags and boxes must be removed. Please do not use this as a Dump Site.

RV PARK

The Town of Legal has 16 stalls at the RV Park (8 stalls are serviced with water, sewer, & power). The rates are as follows:

Monthly rate - \$450 for serviced stall with water, sewer and power

Nightly rate - \$20 for serviced stall with water, sewer and power

Nightly rate - \$15 for serviced stall with power

Nightly rate - \$10 for non-serviced stall

Group Camping rate - \$100 per night (designated area including 8 non -serviced stalls). Reservations are only accepted for monthly campers and the group camping area. Call the Town Office for more information.

FETE AU VILLAGE & RV PARK

Please note the following changes for camping at the Legal RV Park during the Fete au Village weekend (July 22-24):

- Tenting area will be closed for the weekend

- There will be a max of 22 stalls available on a first come first serve basis

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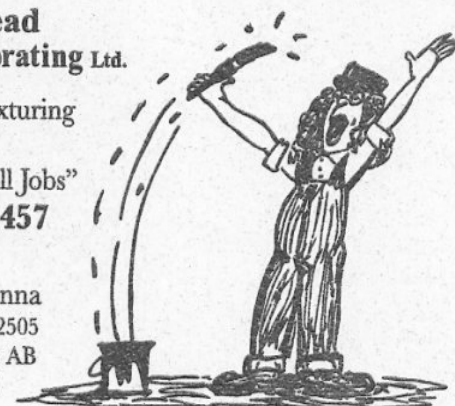

Fire up the BBQ & have the kids make dad a Father's day treat!

SENSATIONAL SIRLOIN KABOBS

Prep Time: 15 min Cook Time: 15 min

Ready In: 8-1/2hrs By: allrecipes.com

INGREDIENTS:

1/4 cup soy sauce	3 tbsp. light brown sugar
3 tbsp distilled white vinegar	1/2 tsp garlic powder
1/2 tsp seasoned salt	4 fl/oz lemon-lime flavoured carbonated beverage
2 lb beef sirloin steak, cut into 1 1/2 inch cubes	2 green bell peppers, cut into pieces
1/2 lb fresh mushrooms, stems removed	1 pint cherry tomatoes
1 fresh pineapple—peeled, cored and cubed	skewers

DIRECTIONS:

1. In a medium bowl, mix soy sauce, light brown sugar, distilled white vinegar, garlic powder, seasoned salt, garlic pepper seasoning, and lemon-lime flavoured carbonated beverage. Reserve about 1/2 cup of this marinade for basting. Place steak in a large re-sealable plastic bag. Cover with the remaining marinade, and seal. Refrigerate for 8 hours, or overnight.
2. Bring a saucepan of water to a boil. Add green peppers, and cook for 1 minute, just to blanch. Drain, and set aside.
3. Preheat grill for high heat. Thread steak, green peppers, mushrooms, tomatoes, and pineapple onto skewers in an alternating fashion. Discard marinade and the bag. Lightly oil the grill grate. Cook kabobs on the prepared grill for 10 minutes, or to desired doneness. Baste frequently with reserved marinade during the last 5 minutes of cooking.

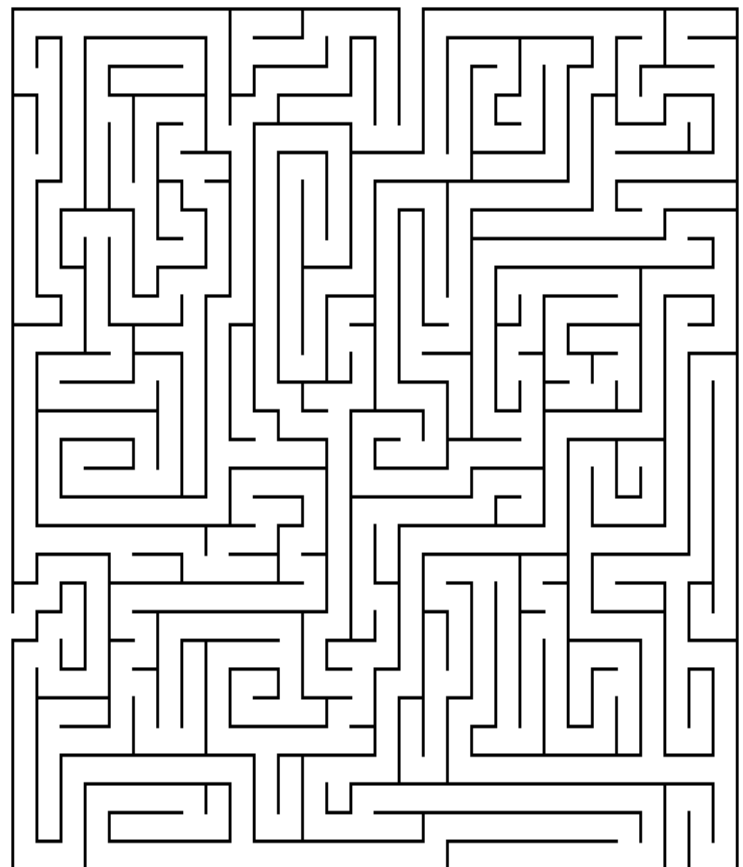
