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

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THE TEMPORARY FOREIGN WORKER

PROGRAM, IN MY OPINION.

Sure the program has its' misgivings. Everything does. Some employers abuse the program and some potential employees also. My two negative concerns with the program are:

- 1. How the program seems to be designed to encourage potential employers to employ persons over skilled or over qualified for the position. It appears that low skilled persons applying for a low skilled job will not likely be approved for a work permit. However, a highly skilled person applying for a low skilled job will likely be approved for the same work permit. This concerns me, because employers that hire high skilled persons for the low skilled job realize the potential of these employees and in SOME, (NOT ALL) circumstances, utilize the higher skills which, was not approved, not offered to Canadians and the temporary worker is not compensated properly for the higher skilled work. Rather, if low skilled persons were approved for low skilled work, employers would not find the ability to utilize higher skills (that would not exist) in an illegal fashion.
- Secondly, my concern (although you will see me contradict later) is how these "temporary" workers are seemingly very quickly and somewhat "expectedly", becoming permanent residents. If we "temporarily" need these workers and we believe the future economy will not necessarily provide the job boom that we presently have why are these workers not staying as "temporary workers" rather than allowing the change to "permanent residents"?

BUT NOW..... I beg Canadians to think about this.....

I have yet to come across a recently graduated Canadian that aspires to work in the fast food chain. Or any of these "low position jobs". I have nephews and nieces that are recently new to the job market. I have yet to hear any of them complain that they cannot get the job they desire because of temporary foreign workers competing with them. These same young Canadians seem to have no trouble getting a job that pays them much more than they would get at the fast foods. So I beg the question, who are the majority of these temporary workers in conflict with? Is there anyone?

Please think about this. If the temporary foreign worker program disappears and our economy continues for any length of time, I think we all would agree there would be a worker shortage. How will our government deal with the situation? I fear that the only "fix" the government could provide would be "new immigrants". I am not against immigrants, but think about this!! Who does the immigration program usually allow to become new immigrants? I think, usually the very wealthy, entrepreneurs or highly educated. This sounds like a good way to choose your immigrants right? But here are the problems, if we remove the low skilled temporary workers with highly educated or rich immigrants will the new immigrants work in the fast food chain or low skilled occupations? I highly doubt so!! If they are so skilled or wealthy they will likely take the high skilled jobs. Our young Canadians will have to compete with this. Who will end up working in the fast food chains or low skilled occupations??.....I think it will likely be our own children!! Also, please contemplate what will happen in either scenario if/when our economy takes a down swing. With temporary workers, if there are no jobs, they go home. If we immigrate some wealthy, highly educated person firstly, they go nowhere. They stay here. Now they compete on the job market. Who is now unemployed??

But now, the last thing to think about which I will contradict the question as to whether these workers should be allowed permanent residency, statistically, I believe the Canadian population is depleting without immigration. The baby boomers are retiring. Our Canada Pension Plan is always a concern if it will survive. One thing I am certain is that we need people to pay into the plan and to pay taxes if indeed the plan is to continue. Canadians seem to be slacking in providing the future workers we need to continue the retirement plans and health care needed (by not making enough offspring). So to some extent possibly we need more immigrants.

I absolutely support the temporary foreign worker program. I think it makes absolute sense to provide the work force we need temporarily.

Should we allow these workers to become permanent residents where they will bring their children, parents, spouses? If so, when should they be allowed? Who should they be allowed to bring? This, I am not so certain of!

Should the workers skills match the job required? If the skills matched the job, employers would have much less ability to abuse the program, and matching low skills would benefit foreign persons of whom need help the most (as the poorest in the world are not the most skilled or educated)!!!

However, if we allow the status to change to permanent residents, is it good to have higher skills or lower skills? Lower skills would not compete with our children. But, higher skills would benefit the Canadian "economy".

Is this a topic we, as Canadians should voice our thoughts?

DID YOU KNOW

- The pond at the Centennial Park (Day-use park) is not safe at any time during the year. Parents, please advise your children to stay away from the pond. This is very dangerous.
- Temporary Shelters (tarp buildings) and Sea-Cans are accessory buildings and therefore require permits.
- Fencing and Decks must abide by the regulations of the Land Use Bylaw #05-2013.
- Land Use Bylaw: No person shall keep or permit in any Residential District more than 1 unlicensed vehicle for more than 14 days.
- Get ready for winter! Please remove all curb ramps from the street prior to snowfall, as they obstruct the grader and bobcat during snow removal. The Town of Legal will not accept responsibility for damages.

<u>PERMITS:</u> BUILDING - RENOVATING - ADDITIONS

The Town of Legal has a new Land Use Bylaw which indicates when a permit is required for sheds, greenhouses, decks, garages, additions, fireplaces, hot tubs, wood burning stoves, demolitions, temporary tarp shelters, swimming pools, sea-cans, etc. The Town of Legal will need to approve the development prior to The Inspections Group issuing any building permits. If a development is constructed on any property without the proper permits, the property owner may be required to demolish, remove or replace the said development. Failure to obtain proper permits PRIOR TO DEVELOPMENT APPROVAL FROM THE TOWN may result in fines being imposed. If you require any information please contact the Town Office at 780-961-3773 or review the Land Use Bylaw which can be found on the Town website under Office - Bylaws -Land Use Bylaw #05-2013.

TOWN OF LEGAL - SEWER SYSTEM

As society uses more convenient, disposable products, Legal's drainage system is dealing with items that were never meant to be disposed of in the sewer system. Basically, the only thing you should ever flush down a toilet is human waste (urine and feces) and toilet paper.

Here is a list of some things to keep out of the toilet:

disposable diapers, tampons & tampon applicators, sanitary napkins, cotton balls & swabs, mini or maxi pads, condoms, cleaning wipes of any kind, facial tissue, bandages & bandage wrappings,

automotive fluids, paint, solvents, sealants, thinners, poisons & hazardous waste.

The Public Works Dept considers these items "unflushables." (Even those items that claim to be flushable on the packaging usually are not.) These items should be placed in the household garbage or taken to an Eco Station. Unflushables cause sewer blockages resulting in backups that can be costly for homeowners and the Town. These items cause water treatment effluent at the wastewater stabilization pond.

TOWN OF LEGAL GARBAGE COLLECTION -Bylaw 84-94

Help protect our pets & wildlife and prevent pests/bugs!

Part 3(1) - Every household shall maintain garbage receptacles which shall have proper and tightly fitting covers

Keep garbage bags less than 45lbs!

Part 4(5) - The Village shall not be required to remove any waste material from any receptacle which, with it contents, exceeds forty-five (45) pounds of weight.




